YOUR LIBRARY CARD IS NOW EVEN MORE VALUABLE



Your Kokomo-Howard County Public Library card just got a lot more valuable. When you see it in your wallet, you're seeing an additional \$200. That's because each card-holding patron can download from FreegalMusic three FREE songs each week from Sony Music's catalog of hundreds of thousands of songs from legendary artists. Unlike the eBooks you download free from the KHCPL that "disappear" from your eReader after two weeks and go back into a digital database, the FreegalMusic songs are yours. Forever. That's right. Once downloaded, they're yours.

If you consider that you pay \$1.29 for most downloadable songs, a patron downloading three free songs per week for a year is saving \$200.

That's \$800 worth of free music for a family of four.

KHCPL now has a subscription with Library Ideas to provide FreegalMusic.

Freegal comes from the words "free" and "legal" combined.

FAMILY FIRST Program @ KHCPL

The Family First program at the Kokomo-Howard County Public Library is offered to help families build a cycle of literacy by reading and learning together. The program will give caregivers the tools and confidence to read to their children and to encourage their children to develop a lifelong love of reading. The program is structured so that families can share the joy and value of reading together in a family-centered library environment. The program is funded through an Early Childhood Reading Grant from Target.

Family First programs are held once a month at each of the KHCPL locations. Programs will be led by trained children's librarians and include a family reading activity and discussion, and a hands-on activity or craft. Each child will receive a new book at each program. Community workers may be invited to participate in programs, speak to the families about the importance of reading in their lives, and read books to the families.

During the year, three sessions of Family First will be offered. Registration will be limited to 30 children per session at KHCPL Main and KHCPL South, and 15 at KHCPL Russiaville. Families will be able to attend one five-month session. Families will keep a reading log during the five-month session and a follow up reading log for six weeks after they have completed the program. On completion, the families will receive a Family First reading certificate.

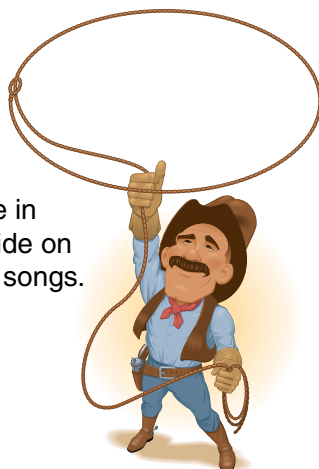

Overdrive eBooks are NOW Available on Kindles!

You don't have to pay for eBooks or Audio downloads. You can download them FREE through the Kokomo-Howard County Public Library.

Here's how:

1. Go to www.KHCPL.org. On the home page, click on the Overdrive icon.
2. To find additional copies available only to KHCPL patrons, click on "Sign In" at the top right, then click on "Kokomo-Howard County Public Library" and key in your library card number and PIN.
3. Find the "Quick Search" area on the left side and search by author or title.
4. Find the "Collections" area to view titles that are new or recently returned. Titles that are always available are listed under "eBooks — Always Available" (Project Gutenberg) and "Disney Online Books". Music and video downloads can also be found here.
